

WHAT COUNTS AS MODEST?

In order to create a safe and pure environment for teens, we ask that everyone bring modest clothing to camp. While it's hard to define what modest is, here are some basic guidelines.

MODEST CLOTHES

- No short shorts (shorts should be mid-thigh length or longer)
- No low cut or spaghetti strap tank tops
- No low cut shirts
- No exposed underwear
- No clothing that exposes breasts, butts, or midriffs
- Gender-born appropriate clothing
- No clothing with obscene/inappropriate language or suggestive themes, sayings, or pictures

MODEST SWIMSUITS

- Swimsuits should conform to the above rules
- Girls should wear a 1 piece, non-revealing swimsuit (tankini's are ok provided they look like a 1 piece). Girls can also choose to wear a dark t-shirt over the top of their swimsuit
- Guys, no speedos or swimsuits that are revealing

ARE LICE CHECKS REQUIRED?

YES! Shiloh Park requires that every camper be checked for lice. To speed up the check-in process, please have your teens checked for lice by a professional (nurse, nurse practitioner, physician, physician assistant, or cosmetologist) before coming to camp. Students who already have their hair checked for lice will get through registration faster.

ARE TEENS ALLOWED TO DRIVE TO CAMP?

NO! In order for us to provide the best safety for all, a camper should not drive a vehicle to camp. Please find appropriate transportation (with church or parents) to and from camp!

HOW DO I BECOME A SR. HIGH CAMP COUNSELOR?

Counselors must be at least 21 years or older at the time of camp. All counselors must have a background check and successfully complete ministry safe training. Ministry safe is valid for 2 years and must be renewed ever 2 years. Background checks are valid for 2 years. Pastoral recommendations will be conducted. Counselors should mail their ministry safe certificates and proof of background checks, along with their camp counselor form filled out correctly to:
